The City of Tallahassee reminds you to avoid disposing of your used cooking oils down the drain.

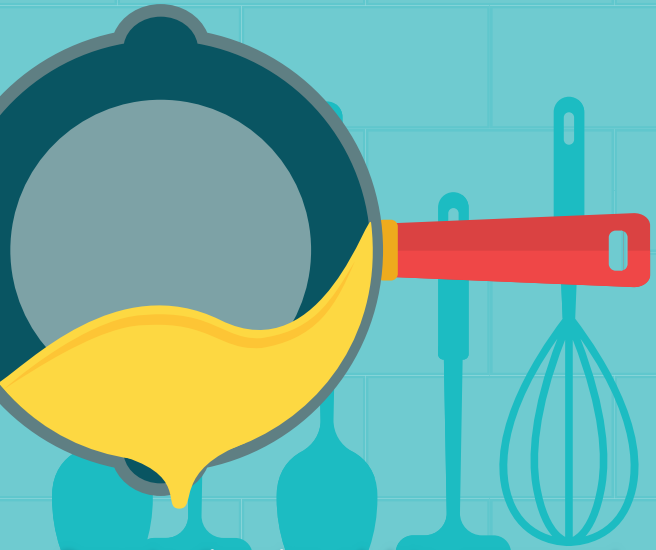
By disposing of your used cooking oil down the drain, you can cause clogs and back-ups to the sewer system.

To dispose of your used cooking oils properly, consider recycling them for free with the City's Alternative Fuel Program, where your used oil is cleaned and processed into biodiesel.



To contribute to the City's Alternative Fuel Program, bring the plastic container filled with your used cooking oil to any of the collection sites listed below.
